Sonowal inaugurates AMCH link road

**The road will help patients coming from different places to get timely treatment:
Sonowal**

Dispur, October 12: Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal today inaugurated a link road connecting Dibrugarh Medical College and Hospital with National Highway 37 which has been built under Dibrugarh Town Infrastructural Development Fund involving a financial outlay of Rs. 4.42 crore.

Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Sonowal said that with the inauguration of this upgraded and widened 1.626 km road connecting Assam Medical College and Hospital with National Highway 37, the development momentum of the 180 years old road connectivity took a positive dimension. He also said that with the upgradation of the road, patients coming from far flung places to Assam Medical College and Hospital would be benefitted greatly to get timely medical intervention.

Chief Minister Sonowal also said that under the able leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, State government has been working on a mission mode to usher in a connectivity revolution in the state. He said that it is because of the unconditional patronage of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, 15 thousand km roads were built in the state under PMGSY. Moreover, State government has taken steps for converting 1000 wooden bridges into concrete ones. Similarly, the lines in 800 tea gardens in the state which were neglected by the successive state governments in the state, were upgraded and made them motorable with the help of pavers blocks. Stating that development of road connectivity leads to sustained economic development, Sonowal said that realising this the governments at the Centre and State have been working unrelentingly. He also said that under the leadership of the Prime Minister three bridges over the Brahmaputra were inaugurated and the works for five more bridges over the river are going on. He also said that the project implementation which were halted because of the lackadaisical attitude of the previous governments got implemented because of the special care and sincerity of the Centre towards Assam.

Speaking on the occasion, MLA Dibrugarh Prasanta Phukan said that with the inauguration of the road, patients coming from Tinsukia to Dibrugarh would be greatly benefitted. He also said that very shortly provision for drains with the fencing and solar street lights will be made available for the benefits of the patients and pedestrians.

The function which was also addressed by Union Minister of State for Food Processing Rameswar Teli, MLA Terosh Gowala, MLA Rituporna Baruah, and a host of other dignitaries were also present.
