Sonowal attends Punjab National Bank's loan mela

Asks bank fraternity to introduce Ease of Getting Loan in line with Ease of Doing Business

Dispur, January 7: Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal participated in a loan mela organised by the Zonal Office of Punjab National Bank at Dharapur here today and presented the sanction letters of loans to different beneficiaries. On the occasion, Sonowal inaugurated the bank's Kamrup district Circle Office and Zonal Audit Office and PNB loan point.

Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Sonowal said, "For maintaining our selfdignity we need to become self-reliant".
