CM attends 'Udyam Assam'

CM calls for innovation to add value to traditional products

Dispur, June 7: Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal called for innovation to add value to the traditional products of the State to capture global market. The Chief Minister made this call while taking part as chief guest at "Udyam Assam – celebrating success, supporting Startup dreams", a celebratory event commemorating the success of Assam Startup – The Nest at Ambari in Guwahati today.

Noteworthy that Assam Startup – The Nest under the aegis of Industry and Commerce Department of the State Government, in the first year of its foundation has incubated 75 Startups. These Startups with turnover of around 11 crore have generated 1690 direct and over 40 thousand indirect employments so far.

Therefore, to draw their attention and capturing world market, there is an urgent need to be innovative. However, in view of changing consumer behaviour, there is a need to be more innovative and IT enabled services would help in giving marketing advantage to these products, he added.

The Chief Minister said that initiatives like Startup India, Skill India, Digital India and Make in India launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi set the ball rolling for a level playing field for Indian entrepreneurs in global platform. He also observed that these programmes have started to deliver results now with Indian Startups making strong presence in global market.

Stating the latest success of the entrepreneurs as a strong testimony of innovative ideas of youth of the State, the Chief Minister urged the young generation to come up with more innovation to position Assam more visibly in global market. He also viewed that achievement made by the young entrepreneurs would encourage the youth in the State to take up Startup as a career. The Chief Minister also appreciated efforts of the Industry and Commerce Department to transform the centre into a front ranking Startup initiative.
