Dispur, March 8: 'Students must work hard to achieve success in life and must equally engage in academics, sports and cultural activities. Parents and teachers should fullfill their responsibility to instill human values in the younger generation so that they can become able citizens.' Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal today said while speaking at the closing ceremony of golden jubilee celebration programme of Na Bhanga Bapuji High School at Puranamati, Na Bhanga Gaon in Golaghat district.

Appreciating the role played by the school to spread the light of education in this flood affected area, Chief Minister Sonowal urged the students to follow the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi for ensuring cleanliness in their surroundings. He also called on the young generation to utilise their times properly as time management is very important for achieving success in life. Terming dedication, hard work and perseverance as important traits of successful person's personality, the Chief Minister underlined the need for the young generation to keep their health in good condition through sports and the need to stay away from drugs.

Announcing Rs. 20 lakh for building a playground in the school under CMSGUY and another Rs. 20 lakh for construction of extra class rooms from his untied fund, the Chief Minister highlighted different schemes announced in state budget 2020-21 for various sections of the society like farmers, divyangs, youth, women etc. Saying that the students have the potential to establish Assam at the world stage he urged them to study at least 10 hours a day to make this dream a reality. He also called on the young people to use social media responsibly and not to spread rumours and misinformation on social media which can disturb the peace and harmony of the state.
