CM inaugurates new building of Biswanath Chariali police station under MOITRI scheme

Police empowerment to continue to deal with modern day crimes: CM

Dispur, February 22: Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal dedicated the new building of Biswanath Chariali Police Station to the service of the people at a function held at Biswanath today. It may be noted that the police station has been built under MOITRI (Mission for Overall Improvement of Thana for Responsive Image) Scheme involving a financial outlay of Rs. 1.88 crores.

Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Sonowal said that the MOITRI scheme was a fall out of the All India DGP & IPG Conference held at Guwahati in the year 2015, where Prime Minister Narendra Modi called for smart police for the protection of lives of properties of all sections of the people.
