### Union Home Minister inaugurates Radio Therapy Block of State Cancer Institute at GMCH and dedicates newly installed state-of-the-art Linear Accelerator machine to the service of the people

### Union Home Minister Amit Shah launches 'Prarthana' scheme and ceremonially lays foundation stone of Tamulpur Medical College & Hospital

**Dispur, July 25:** In a bid to take forward Assam government's efforts to reach to the affected people of COVID-19, especially those who lost their family members in the pandemic, Union Home Minister Amit Shah handed over financial assistance to 100 selected beneficiaries of 'Prarthana' Scheme in a programme held at Srimanta Sankardev Kalakshetra in Guwahati today. Under the scheme, Assam Government is providing Rs 1 lakh to the next of kin of deceased Covid patients.

Moreover, strengthening health infrastructure in the BTR, the Union Home Minister also ceremonially laid the foundation stone of 430 bedded Tamulpur Medical College & Hospital at today's programme.

While speaking on the occasion, the Union Home Minister said that the NDA government under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given a special focus for development of the North Eastern region. He said that Prime Minister's 35 visits to the region in last 7 years and induction of 5 ministers in the Union Cabinet from the region is a clear indication of the Union Government's commitment for growth of the North East.

Further saying that under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Bodoland Agreement was signed, the Home Minister stated that the government has already delivered 90% of conditions of the agreement.

Reiterating the Union Government's commitment for protecting and preserving Assam's language, its heritage, and glorious culture, the Union Home Minister said that the language, dialects, cuisines, and cultural traditions of Assam and North East are India's jewels and the government would preserve these.

Chief Minister Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma during his speech thanked the Union Home Minister for his visit to Assam to launch the state government's initiatives on the health care sector. He said that under the leadership and guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah a new chapter for lasting peace in the state dawned with the

signing of BTR Accord. He also informed that while most of the conditions have already been fulfilled, rest would also be brought to fruition soon.

The Chief Minister further said that in last six decades after independence there were only six medical colleges in Assam. However, the BJP led government after coming to power intiated steps for setting up 23 new medical college, out of which few are completed while many are on various stages of implementation process.

He further informed that the Assam government in a bid to providing succour to the Covid affected families, especially those who lost their family members initiated Chief Minister's Sishu Sewa Achoni, Chief Minister's Widow Support Scheme and Prarthana Scheme. Under Prarthana Scheme, Rs. one lakh would be provided to 5114 nos next of kin of deceased Covid patients.

While Chief Secretary Jishnu Barua delivered the welcome speech, the Programme was also addressed by Health & Family Welfare Minister Keshab Mahanta and BTC Chief Pramod Bodo. Speaker of the Assam Legislative Assembly Biswajit Daimary and several Minister of the State government were present in the programme.

Earlier today, giving a major boost to Assam and NE's cancer treatment infrastructure, the Union Home Minister inaugurated the Radio Therapy Block of State Cancer Institute at GMCH and also dedicated the newly installed state-of-the-art Linear Accelerator machine at the centre to the service of the people. This treatment facility apart from tremendously augmenting state's fight against cancer and is expected to bring succour to the affected people in the region.
