Chief Minister lays foundation stone of CM's Seuj Uddyan Achoni

Dispur, May 10: With a view to make pollution free Assam a reality, Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal laid the foundation stone of CM's Seuj Uddyan Achoni at Mikirpara area under Rani Reserve Forest today.
